Hubbard County Senior Nutrition

Hubbard County Senior Nutrition is the Non-profit board that provides meals for seniors through Meals on Wheels, Congregate dining, and the Diner's club at local restaurants at low cost : www.HubbardCountySeniorMeals.org

In the past the program was administered by Lutheran Social Services. Now that has changed. We get our program benefits through Nutrition Services, Inc. which is funded in part, under the Federal Older Americans Act and approved by the Minnesota Board on Aging.

The new cooks are still operating out of Nevis Senior Center; but as soon as the kitchen is installed at the new Living at Home building in Park Rapids, they will cook and distribute food from the new location.

This transitional year we are raising funds for the completion of the new kitchen.

ARCC EMERGENCY SHELTER.

Our gifts help a person or family start over as they begin to heal from their trauma. People will come to the shelter for a safe place to live; some move on from the shelter and begin to rebuild a new home—with no furniture or other household items. Some will arrive at the shelter without a change of clothing or shoes on their feet.

All the backpacks gifted to the Shelter by First Lutheran Church in the past have been gifted to the children of clients over the course of the school year. This August we are again assembling backpacks full of school supplies.
